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As I look back over the years since I was truly saved, I ask myself was it really worth it?

Sadly, even though I was raised in a Christian home, attended a Christian school and regularly attended a Southern Baptist church, I was still lost. I played church all my life, went to youth outings, and after church fellowships while growing up, all this, but I still “played” church. After growing up I attended church and would act one way around those people then another way at work or around my buddies.

All my life I cared only about myself, I didn't care who I hurt. In 1981, I started my career as a law enforcement officer in the State of Florida working in undercover work before going to street patrol. My life was a mess to say the least.

During my years as an officer, I struggled in some areas of my job, but refused to give up finding the answers I wanted and needed. The job started getting to me. I was dealing with the everyday struggles of stress that comes with wearing a badge and I can remember how I would get so sick of the crime scenes, the attitude of the people and dealing with administration on a day-to-day basis.

I started becoming numb to people's feelings and would go to calls hoping that something would go wrong so I would get hurt or even killed. I just stopped caring about myself and my life.

Then one day a fellow deputy came to me and asked if I would attend church with him. I told him I didn't want the roof to fall in on me and I didn't need God anymore.

The next week the same deputy told me that someone at his church told him to tell me "Hi" and if I would come to church again, he would like to see me. I told him to let me think about it first. I couldn't get that

simple gesture off my mind. I kept wondering who was in that church that knew me? Soon after that I did attend church again and found out that hte person was Jesus Christ. I started attending church on a regular basis and then started talking with the pastor, but like always I just got tired of going and I quit.

In 1991, my grandmother passed away and about 3 months later, I took my mother back to south Florida so she could go through some of the family things and deal with Grandma Mac's Estate.. While I was there I asked to attend the church I was raised in. On Saturday night I was so uncomfortable for some reason. I couldn't stop thinking about going to church again. On Sunday night I went anyway, but something happened that rainy night in south Florida. I finally looked at life completely different than I ever had before. For the first time I realized I was lost and going to Hell unless i asked Jesus Christ to forgive me of all my sins and come into my heart. I can remember kneeling down beside my friend's car and asking Jesus Christ to save me. Man what a difference I felt in my heart. In the Bible it says, *"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new"* 2 Corinrhains 5:17.

When I returned home to North Florida, my job and everything was different. I started talking about what had happened to me with my fellow officers. Some of them were cautious to say the least. A short time later I had to retire from law enforcement because of injuries that I acquired through the years.

After leaving law enforcement, I thought that I would return to my hometown of Belle Glade, FL, try to put my life back together and rebuild my life. I am now in full time ministry and with evangelism and outreach to the law enforcement communities.

So, the big question is, **“Was It Really Worth It?” Yes it was!!!** It is the best thing that has ever happened in my life. Now, my question to you is, “Are you saved?” “Are you going to Heaven?” The Bible says, *“As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:”* Romans 3:10. It also says, *“For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;”* Romans 3:23. And in Romans 5:12 it says, *“Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned.”* But there is hope in the next scripture.

The Bible says, *“For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord”* Romans 6:23. Look at what else it says, *“But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
